Cross-border Conservation Initiative in Bhutan

Supratim (Raj) Basu who is also the Secretary General (Siliguri Chapter) of IBFA (India-Bhutan Friendship Association) has opened dialogue with His Excellency The Crown Prince of Bhutan, Nature Conservation Division, Bhutan, Royal Manas National Park Authority, Bhutan , Govt.of Assam and West Bengal regarding Cross-border conservation in Bhutan and Assam- Bengal Dooars, establishing peace and people to people relationship between the two countries. Ecotourism and School-level programmes have been identified as two major instruments to achieve the goal and also to attract International support to such initiative.
